

## TOWER HILL BOTANIC GARDEN AN IDEAL LOCATION FOR BIRDING

**T**ower Hill Botanic Garden has developed a remarkable reputation as a wonderful resource to observe and learn about thousands of fascinating plants. Because of this grand diversity, it has also become home to many species of birds, both rare and common to New England.

The **Wildlife Garden**, located in a secluded area below the main gardens, has features including a vernal pool and a human-sized “birdhouse” viewing station surrounded by native flora and fauna. The Wildlife Garden provides a ideal location for birders to observe a variety of birds, attracted by eight bird feeders maintained year-round. The remaining 132 acres of the Tower Hill property are no exception. Any birder, experienced or novice, can enjoy a leisurely walk through the garden and trails while viewing dozens of different bird families and their allies. A recent survey by an accredited bird-watching group counted more than 56 species of birds nesting at Tower Hill!

Be sure to take along this check list of birds, previously spotted at Tower Hill. Though many of the hunting birds and songbirds’ favorite time of day is just after dawn, Tower Hill’s hours of operation still affords plenty of opportunities for observation and sightings – the birds enjoy the spectacular greenery and plant diversity as much as we do!

**Listen, look, learn, and love are four key points for successful bird watching** – **Listen** for the birds’ song; **Look** for distinguishing colors and markings; **Learn** about the birds in your field guide; **Love** and respect the birds in their natural habitat.
